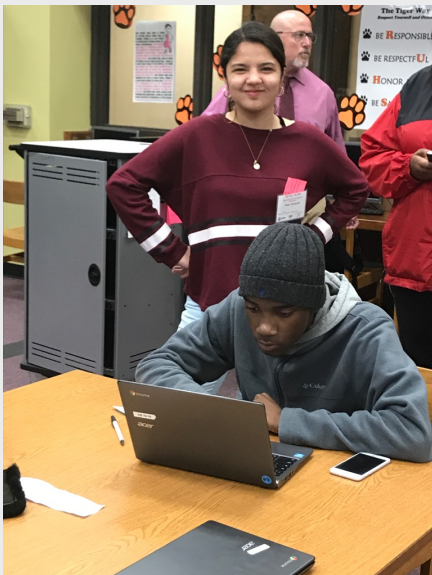

Student Council Members Hold Voter Registration Event

Student Council members at Riverside University High School were trained by the League of Women Voters of Milwaukee County to assist eligible students to register to vote. Thanks to Tom Wilde, Student Council Advisor for his support!

Twenty-five student council members attended a one-hour training session presented by the League of Women Voters of Milwaukee County. At the end of the training, each student council member was given a Voter Advocate badge.

Two days later, the Student Council sponsored a registration event in the high school library during second period. Some of the members went to the senior classrooms and invited eligible students to come to the library to register. The other student council members welcomed the students and



introduced them to MyVote.wi.gov website. League of Women Voters volunteers were on hand to assist and answer any questions. In a one hour class period, 19 students registered to vote.

The Student Council members agreed that the website was easy to navigate, and they felt confident that they could assist friends and family members to register.

Talk to Graduating Seniors

Ordinarily when a registered voter moves, he/she must re-register to vote. An exception is made for people who are away from home during an election. College students who are registered at their home address and who have a Wisconsin Driver's License or Wisconsin ID Card showing that home address can maintain their registration as long they are away at school.

Voting Absentee is a good option for students because registering at the new college address can be challenging. By using their home registration, students can easily request an absentee ballot online using the MyVote.wi.gov website. The student simply provides the new mailing address online and prints out and mails the absentee request along with a photocopy of the Driver's License or Wisconsin ID. Students must request an absentee ballot early enough to receive it and return it for counting on election day.
